




WORKSHOP - LEAVENWORTH LANDSCAPE






WORKSHOP - GLACIAL GEOLOGY OF BOUNDARY BUTTE AND THE ICICLE RIVER VALLEY

Glaciers advance and retreat, leaving geologic evidence of their change over time. The Icicle Glacier left evidence of multiple advances in the Leavenworth, WA region that can be observed from sites on Boundary Butte and in Icicle Canyon. Join Geologist Kelsay Stanton for a day in the field as we explore these features and the glacial history inferred from geologic evidence.


