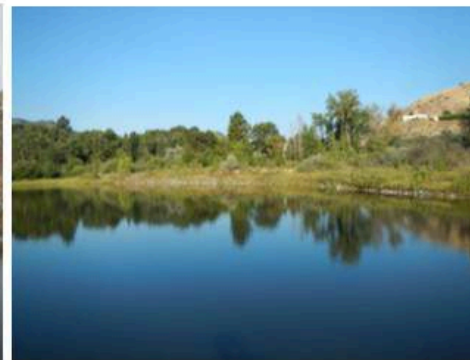

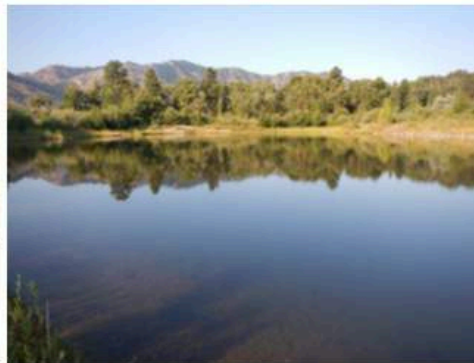

- Pond has typical wetland vegetation of willow, grass, sedge, cattail, red osier dogwood, heavy algae bloom.
- Upland is black cottonwood, ponderosa pine, shrubs, including oregon grape, big sagebrush, poison oak, invasive knapweed.

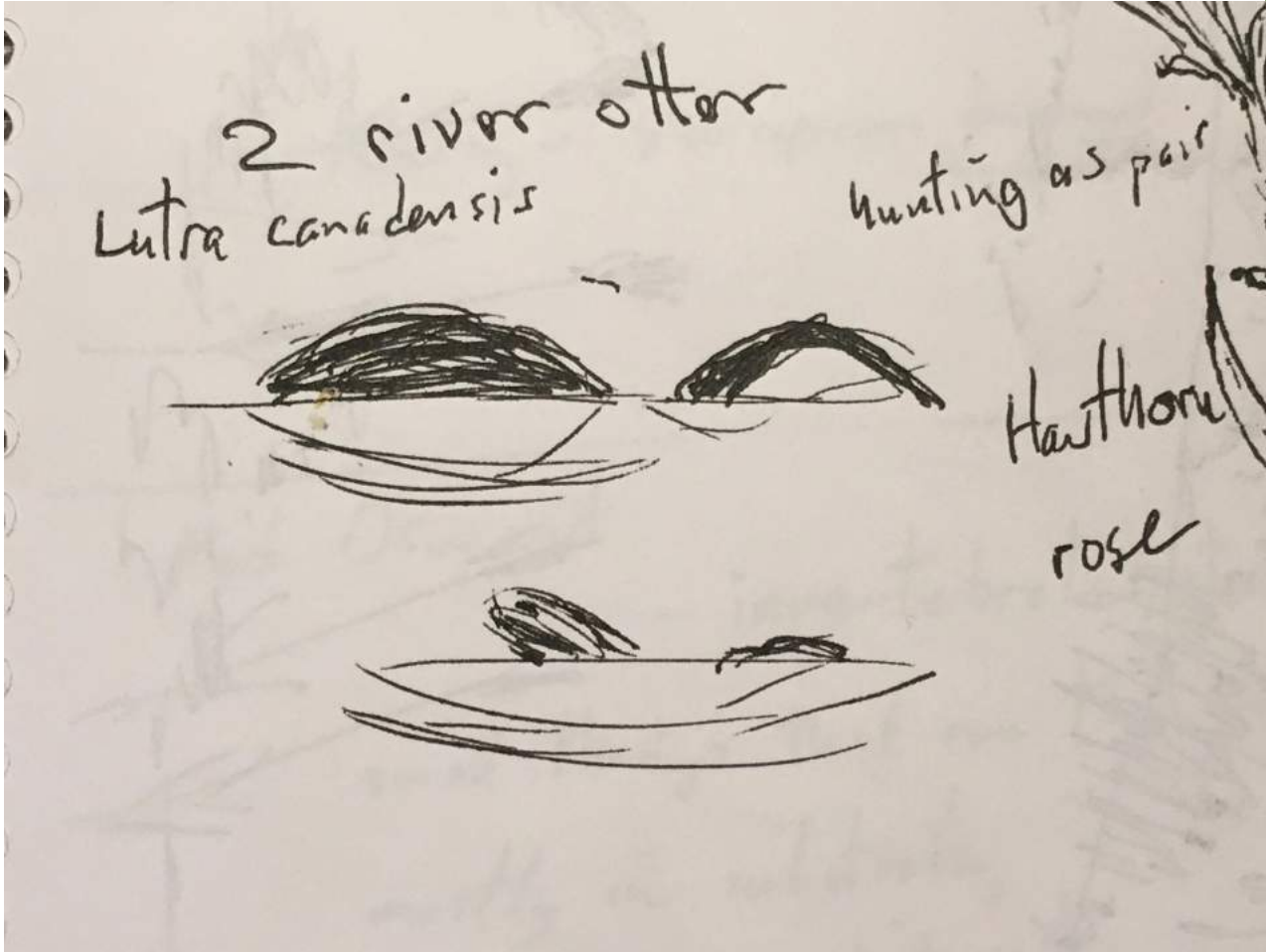
