## **Partnering Programs**

All partnering programs throughout the country provide classroom and field sciencebased training in wildlife and natural resources that focus on local ecosystems. They also provide conservation outreach and service within participant communities.

Graduates of Master Naturalist and related programs make an amazing contribution to education and stewardship in their state. Because of numerous networking opportunities, ANROSP partners experience rapid and great success in training their volunteers.

#### **Programs in Action:**

- The South Carolina Master Naturalist program went statewide in 2007 and trained over 377 participants who provided over 2,300 hours of volunteer service within the first year.
- The Virginia Master Naturalist program, launched in 2006, has over 1000 active volunteers who completed more than 150,000 hours of service.
- The Fort Collins, Colorado Master Naturalist volunteers provide educational programs almost daily reaching 11,000 people annually.
- Texas Master Naturalist program has over 40 chapters and trained over 5,300 volunteers who contributed over 1 MILLION hours of service!
