

# Use the eBird website



We recommend that you enter your checklist data using the eBird website (above).


1. After completing your hummingbird survey, go to [www.ebird.org](http://www.ebird.org) and click on the “sign in”



2. Sign in using your eBird username and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can click on “Forgot Password” and they will send a link to your email that allows you to reset your password.




3. Click on “Submit”



4. Enter data for:

- Date
- Observation Type
- Start Time
- Duration
- Party Size
- Comments - enter any observation comments you have

Then click on “Continue”



Checklist Comments: 23 degrees F.. Wind:0-2; 10" of snow on ground. Anna's Hummingbird at the heated feeder at 07:10. It stayed there until 07:48 (38 minutes). It flew to a perch and returned to the feeder at 08:02. It departed and perched in a nearby shrub. Two Anna's swirled near the feeder 08:06. One disappeared but the other perched in 3 different locations and was still perched when I stopped at 08:16.



5. While the main purpose of the hummingbird survey is to record data about hummingbirds, it is fine to enter all species you see during the survey period. Enter the number of birds you see. You can use the Search area to quickly jump to each species you want to enter




6. When you are done entering the number of birds you saw for each species, scroll to the bottom of the window and select "Yes" or "No" to identify if the list includes ALL the birds you were able to identify.


Then click on "Submit"




7. Your checklist will appear as submitted. Notice the "Share" button in the upper left and the "Add media" button on the right




8. When you click on the “Share” button you will be provided a place to enter the eBird user you want to share your list with. In our case, it is “NCWAHummers”



9. If you have photos to submit, click on “Add media” and you will see a screen like this. Each species in your checklist is shown. You can drag a photo onto the species name to add it. If you click on “add media” on the right you will be able to navigate to where your photo(s) are stored and select them.




Once complete, you will see a thumbnail image of your photos linked to the species in your list.



10. Click on “Done/submit/continue” and you will see a refreshed view of your checklist with the attached photos.

You’re done. You can sign out.





# Use the eBird mobile app


1. Open the eBird mobile app on your device. (The examples are from an iPhone)

2. Click on “start checklist”


3. Notice that “record track” is on as a default. You can leave it “on” or toggle it “off”




4. Enter the species name in the area at the top of the screen




5. I entered “Anna” in the window and the species name appears in the space below the search window. Tap on that name



6. Enter the number of birds seen and any notes that you want to make. Tap on “Done” when you are finished.




7. The app now shows your species and the number of birds entered. Repeat steps 4 and 5 until all the bird species are entered into the app. Once you are finished with your survey, tap on “Stop”




8. Tap “stop track” if you see this screen.

Since you did not move during the survey, the app should show “stationary” for the type of count.




9. The review screen seen here does not have a location set and shows one observer and one Anna's counted. Choose a location. eBird will autogenerate a location but you will be able to choose from a list.

Tap on "Choose a location"




10. This screens shows that "Home" has been set as the location.

The screen shows that the checklist is complete and has all the birds I was able to identify.



11. The ability to share a checklist with another eBird user is hidden in the previous screen. Tapping on the Observers increases it to "2" and the "Share checklist with..." magically appears.

This is where you will enter NCWAHummers



12. The final screen shows the location, 2 observers, sharing with 1 other eBirder, complete checklist, and the 1 Anna's.

Tap "submit".
