- <u>Parking</u>: The attached map shows free and paid parking options, and <u>details are here</u>. Discounts offered for seniors (>60 years) and for hybrid or electric vehicles. Parking permits can be purchased at the cashier's office located in Wenatchi Hall. The cashier's office is open Monday-Thursday 8 a.m. 5 p.m. and Friday 8 a.m. noon.
